

Course Summary:	<p>The course addresses the impact of staff misconduct, particularly sexual misconduct on the profession and the individual. Legal ramifications are discussed, along with PREA (The Prison Rape Elimination Act), recognizing red flag behaviors in self and others that may indicate risk of misconduct.</p> <p>Course is based on the recommendations of the National Institute of Corrections and American Probation and Parole Association.</p>
